





Arriving




Main Entrance

Inside the building

on the door to the room





I can go into this room to talk to an adult if I want.

The adult will ask me questions.

The adult will listen to me.

The adults in hearing room 2 can see and hear me but I won't have to see and hear them.

I can sit or move around in the room.

I can have a break when I need a break.



Sensory Waiting Room

We use pictures like this
on the door to the room



Someone I know will be with me.

Sensory Room



Someone I know will be with me.

I can use this room to rest and chill out.

I can use it any time I need to.

The lights can be turned down if I need it to be darker.

There are bubble tubes that I can touch.

I can touch the walls and the floor.



Sensory Wall



Every hearing room has a sensory wall.

I can have a photograph or a picture or a colour I like on the wall.

This could be a photograph of my pets, like the one in the photo.

This can help me to feel calm.

This helps the adults to remember that this is my hearing, and it is all about me.



Breakout space



Every hearing room has a breakout space.

This is my space.

There are some screens in front of the breakout space.

There is a beanbag in the breakout space for me to use.

I can use it if I want to take a break at any time.

I will still be able to hear everything that is being said by the adults.
